Summary of Program Highlights

The Centre for Military and Strategic Studies (CMSS) Security and Defence Forum (SDF) Program at the University of Calgary (U of C) remains committed to promoting and developing excellence in military, security and defence studies, and elevating the Centre's profile as a leading Centre of Excellence in North America over the next five years.

The following highlights for the 2005-2006 program year deserve recognition.

Overall University Context and Support

CMSS has received strong support from the University and the Calgary community. The University has a strong interest in military, security and defence studies, as evidenced by the faculty, staff, students, and course offerings at the University, the institutionalization and integration of the research, teaching and public education activities within the University, and the degree to which the University will continue to provide salaries, benefits, space, administrative support, and library resources in support of CMSS. A special thanks to the Faculty of Social Sciences, Faculty of Graduate Studies, the President's Office and Campus Infrastructure.

Acting on a new business plan drafted in August 2004, CMSS has expanded its core faculty and staff; has increased its supervisory and teaching faculty; has appointed two distinguished chair professors; has increased its research associates; and has revamped its cohort of on-campus and adjunct fellows. Time-release, travel and research funding for faculty, research fellows, and graduate students have been quadrupled.

In its *"Raising Our Sights: An Academic Business Plan for the University of Calgary 2002-2006"* the University established four core principles, within which CMSS squarely falls: learning-centered university; research university; multi-disciplinary inquiry; and return to the community. It further identified sixteen critical areas of "prominence and promise" at the University; one of these was "Strategic and International Studies," with CMSS singled out as "one of the University's premier research areas in the world." Thanks to an external review done in January 2005 by external reviewers Dr. Joel Sokolsky, Royal Military College of Canada, and Dr. Denis Showalter, Colorado College, recommendations were made on how to improve upon this program, all of which have been examined for implementation.

With the addition of two \$1 million donations in July 2005, the University appointed Dr. Anne Irwin, Department of Anthropology, the CDFAI Chair in Civil Military Relations and Dr. Mike McKee, Department of Economics, the Arthur J.E. Child Chair in Defence Economics. Funded in combination by the University and external donors, the appointments have broadened and expanded the supervisory, research and teaching capabilities of CMSS.

Engagement of Faculty and Students in SDF Program Activities

The number of U of C students and faculty directly engaged in SDF activities continues to expand. Course offerings and enrolments at both the undergraduate and graduate levels remain high.

CMSS graduated four Master of Strategic Studies (MSS) students and one special case Ph.D. student in 2005-2006. Graduates have accepted positions in government and industry relating to security and defence. As of March 2006, CMSS has 35 MSS students and 7 special case Ph.D. students. Each of our students has a diverse background ranging from Political Science to History to Engineering. Admission offers for September 2006 have been made to eight outstanding MSS applicants (from the University of Calgary, University of Winnipeg, Old Dominion University, University of Toronto, University of Victoria, and Queen's University) and one Ph.D. applicant from the Canadian Forces Leadership Institute.

The Centre continued its support of graduate and undergraduate research assistants and its support of student activities. During the 2005-06 program year, 13 core faculty, 5 research associates and 44 graduate students were engaged in SDF program activities. The Centre was pleased to continue its support of the Calgary Model United Nations Team (UCMUNT) and Society for Military and Strategic Studies (SMSS) and its 8th Annual Conference, *War and Security: From Conflict to Resolution*. Of particular note, CMSS is exploring further collaboration with keynote speaker, Dr. Hrach Gregorian, President, Institute of World Affairs, to complement the Centre's curriculum, focusing on theory of conflict, violence and war, peace operations and peace-building, civil-military cooperation, terrorism and political violence, and globalization, peace and national security.

Faculty Highlights

The Centre's Director, **Dr. David Bercuson**, continues to provide exceptional scholarly expertise on Canadian military history and Canadian defence studies. He was appointed to the Advisory Council on National Security in 2005, providing advice on security, public health and emergencies on national issues. The Queen paid tribute to Canada's military heritage in May 2005 at the Museum of the Regiments, meeting with officers from three Canadian regiments. Dr. Bercuson participated in the celebrations as Honourary Colonel of the 33rd Field Engineer Squadron, Canadian Forces Military Engineers Branch. He received an honorable mention in the Students' Union Teaching Excellence Awards. Along with Dr. Holger Herwig, Bercuson spent numerous nights at book launches for their newly released book, *One Christmas in Washington: The Secret Meeting between Roosevelt and Churchill that Changed the World*.

Dr. Holger Herwig, Canada Research Chair in Military and Strategic Studies, received a three-year Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (SSHRC) research grant for a book, *Slaughter in Paradise: The Nazi Assault on Allied Oil 1942-1943*, to be co-authored with Dr. Bercuson. In May 2005 Holger Herwig joined "Operation Bismarck" aboard the Russian research vessel *Keldysh* in Kiel, Germany. This was Dr. Herwig's second expedition, sponsored by Deep Ocean Expeditions, to the wreck of the German battleship *Bismarck*, destroyed on 27 May 1941.

Dr. Patrick Brennan continues to give lectures, focusing on Canadian military history, at the Museum of the Regiments. He maintains his connection with the Calgary High School International Baccalaureate program, and currently serves as the Graduate Coordinator for CMSS.

Dr. Rob Huebert, Associate Director, contributed numerous book chapters on topics such as resource management, Arctic militarization and pollution and Canadian security. Along with Dr. James Keeley, he published *Commercial Satellite Imagery and United National Peacekeeping: A View from Above*. From January to July 2006, Dr. Huebert will be on sabbatical leave, completing research for a manuscript.

Dr. James Keeley, resident fellow of CMSS and co-editor of the *Journal of Military and Strategic Studies*, continues to produce book chapters, articles and conduct media interviews on non-proliferation, international relations and international order. He and Dr. John Ferris are organizing a workshop, *National Intelligence and International Verification: Weapons of Mass Destruction*, to be held in Calgary, September 2006.

Dr. John Ferris, an expert on military and security affairs, defence policy, and intelligence, has attended conferences at Oxford University, Nichinan University and the University of Wales. These conferences are on a myriad of topics including military theory, intelligence, the changing of war, and the state of armed forces.

Dr. Gavin Cameron published *Nuclear Terrorism: A Threat Assessment for the 21st Century* as well as five articles in journals such as "Terrorism & Political Violence," and "Studies in Conflict and Terrorism". He is also spearheading CMSS' application to formalize the current special case Ph.D. program.

Dr. Alexander Hill and **Dr. David C. Wright**, Department of History, continue as active fellows of CMSS, supervising and teaching graduate students. Dr. Hill spearheaded the Centre's application for an MSS Co-op program, and Dr. Wright hosted a successful Chinese Military History Society conference in May 2005.

Dr. Bob Bergen, Ph.D. graduate from CMSS, has been appointed Adjunct Associate Professor of the Faculty of Social Sciences effective January 2006. He has over two decades experience as a working journalist and leads the CDFAI Canadian Military Journalism Course each year.

Dr. Anne Irwin, CDFAI Chair in Civil Military Relations, will visit Afghanistan on March 12, 2006 for two weeks to continue her research on the Canadian troops in Afghanistan. She will be returning to the Afghanistan theatre of operations in May to continue this research.

Dr. Mike McKee, Arthur Child Chair in Defence Economics, will be participating in a joint conference on defence procurement and recruiting between CMSS and the C.D. Howe Institute in Toronto in May 2006. In addition, Dr. McKee will author a C.D. Howe policy memorandum based on the conference proceedings.

The Faculty of Graduate Studies and CMSS were among eleven organizations to receive a Canadian Forces Liaison Council (CFLC) Provincial Award of Excellence for supporting Canada's Reserve Forces in March 2005. CMSS was nominated by Colonel Charles Hamel, who served as Canadian Contingent Task Force Commander for

Operation Crocodile in support of UN Peace Support Operations in the Democratic Republic of Congo.

SDF Program Highlights, 2005 – 2006

The positive external evaluation in 2005 assisted the Centre in building upon its strengths and existing expertise.

Funding

As a result of a \$2 million funding boost to the Centre's activities over a five-year period, the appointments of Dr. McKee and Dr. Irwin have strengthened and broadened the research, supervisory, and teaching strengths at the University of Calgary.

As indicated in last year's annual report, graduate student support for the MSS program and special case Ph.D. program was expanded as a result of the donations, along with new course offerings, including defence economics, military anthropology, unconventional warfare, and domestic and hemispheric security. An MSS Co-op proposal and a formal Ph.D. program proposal have been submitted for approval and endorsement by the University. With the U of C Press, the Centre continues discussions regarding the creation of a monograph series, specializing in the Centre's research and teaching strengths.

Of particular note, the donations have supported CMSS graduate students through the creation of CDFAI/Child Memorial Doctoral and Masters Scholarships.

Curriculum Development

With the addition of Dr. Irwin and Dr. McKee, the following courses were added for Masters and Doctoral students at the University of Calgary:

*Anthropology 601.95 – **Graduate Seminar in Civil-Military Relations*** (Irwin)

A comparative analysis of relations between civil society and military institutions. This course discusses how civil and military institutions mutually constitute each other as distinct forms of society.

*Economics 611.05 / Strategic Studies 651.50 – **Defence Economics and Policy*** (McKee)

Defence Economics and Policy as applications of applied microeconomics: valuation of the military services as a non-market good, procurement and Research & Development, personnel recruitment and retention, and decision-making under uncertainty.

Over the 2005-06 program year, CMSS held three block week courses to enhance its course offerings. **Dr. Alon Kadish**, Hebrew University of Jerusalem, offered *Issues in Military History*, focusing on Israel's war of Independence. **Dr. Asa Kasher**, the Laura Schwarz-Kipp Chair in Professional Ethics and Philosophy of Practice at Tel Aviv University, Israel, taught *Military Ethics and the Israeli Case*, discussing the Israeli Defence Forces' Code of Ethics. Lastly, **Dr. Joel Sokolsky** from the Royal Military College of Canada taught *Contemporary United States Defence Policy*, in response to recommendations made in the Centre's Unit Review.

New for CMSS graduate students this year was the introduction of funding and travel policies to assist with conference presentations and research travel. A minimum funding policy was adopted for Ph.D. students, guaranteeing \$15,000 for four years, based on satisfactory performance.

CMSS continues to collaborate with other departments to strengthen and broaden specialization options for graduate students. Future offerings may include:

POLI 675 – Issues in Comparative Politics: Coercive Organizations

An advanced research seminar focusing on monitoring and regulation mechanisms across the full range of coercive organization, including militaries, police forces and non-state armed groups. The course will work in conjunction with the coercive organizations research lab (CORL) run by Dr. Pablo Policzer, Canada Research Chair in Latin America Politics.

STST 651 – NGOs, Aid and Contemporary Conflicts (Lara Olson)

This graduate level seminar will draw on both the academic and practitioner debates and literature on the role of NGOs and their humanitarian, development, and peace efforts in areas of conflict.

Council for Canadian Security in the 21st Century

The Council for Canadian Security in the 21st Century (CCS21) was established in November 2001 to raise awareness of security and defence issues and to provide a meaningful forum for Canadians to debate openly about defence policy and the future of the military. CCS21 currently has 1412 registered members, as well as 457 discussion board users. Jack Granatstein returned to his role as Chair of CCS 21 effective January 2006.

Publications

The Centre's faculty, research associates and graduate students sustained a strong publication record for 2005/06, publishing in more than sixty academic and scholarly journals and academic and private presses.

The *Journal of Military and Strategic Studies* continued to receive increased attention, total hits to the JMSS Website increased from 474,591 in 2004/05 to 525,993 in 2005/06. JMSS aims to be a journal of record for debates on contemporary Canadian strategic policy.

Conferences and Events

The Centre sustained its organization and sponsorship with SDF support of over fifty lectures and seminars. Centre associates participated in more than eighty relevant conferences, workshops, seminars, and political meetings.

In October 2005 the Centre was pleased to participate in the second annual SDF Conference, held in Quebec City, and looks forward to future conferences hosted by other SDF Centres.

On February 25 – 26 the High School Model United Nations (HSMUN) team held their annual event for Calgary area high school students. Twenty three high schools participated, sending approximately 450 students to the event. Dr. James Keeley and Dr. Rob Huebert are the faculty advisors for the program.

New Initiatives

Institute for United States Policy Studies – A proposal to establish a University Institute for United States Policy Studies was approved by the University of Calgary on March 8, 2006. The Institute will allow for and promote collaborative research among scholars in areas of importance to United States policy, and will play a key role in assisting the University in the development of a United States Strategy to encompass research, institutional linkages and student recruitment. Dr. Bercuson and **Dr. Stephen Randall**, Dean of the Faculty of Social Sciences, have been instrumental in the development of the Institute.

Canadian Peacebuilding Coordinating Committee (CPCC) – In June 2005 CMSS became an organizational member of this Canadian NGO network devoted to policy dialogue between NGOs, research institutes, and government on how to address the causes and consequences of violent conflict. CMSS affiliates will regularly participate in the annual Peacebuilding and Human Security Consultations in Ottawa, hosted by Foreign Affairs Canada, the Canadian Peacebuilding Coordinating Committee, the Canadian Consortium on Human Security, and the International Development Research Centre. A website on the mandates, multifaceted composition, structures, performance and challenges of current UN and other peace operations that Canada participates in will be created, contributing to public policy debates on international peace operations. CMSS research fellow, Lara Olson, is the CMSS contact for this network.

NGOs, Aid and Conflict Program – This program, led by Research Fellow Lara Olson, will focus on the role that international humanitarian and development aid play in conflict zones and in transitions from war to peace, through research and engaging operational NGOs in ongoing dialogue about lessons from experience. Speakers, workshops and research projects are being proposed to expose students to the critical NGO component of peace operations and nation-building exercises currently undertaken to address today's civil wars and failed states.

Armed Groups (an international academic and NGO practitioner network) – In 2005 CMSS established links with the Armed Groups Project, run by Dr. Pablo Policzer, a research network dedicated to analyzing how armed groups can better comply with humanitarian and human rights norms. The network engages a wide variety of international human rights, humanitarian, and conflict resolution NGOs, and thus will broaden CMSS's contacts with NGO partners working on militaries, police forces and armed groups.

Regimental Histories Digitization Project – External funding has been secured for a Regimental Histories Digitization Project, coordinated by Jan Roseneder, in partnership with the University of Calgary Library, the Museum of the Regiments Library and Archives, the University of London (UK), and the War Office Library in Great Britain.

BiPolar Perspectives on the Future of Ocean's Governance in Polar Areas – Dr. Rob Huebert will be the principle investigator of an international team of arctic scholars

who will be assessing the following issues: Sovereignty and Security; Jurisdictional Issues in Polar Waters; Shipping in Polar Waters; Marine Living Resources in Polar Waters; and, Protection of Polar Marine Environment. These issues have been recognized by the announcement of the third International Polar Year.

New Faculty / Research Associates

Dr. Stephen J. Randall, FRSC, will complete his term as Dean of the Faculty of Social Sciences in June 2006. Dr. Randall will join the Centre as a Research Fellow, contributing expertise on United States national security.

Maureen Hiebert, PhD candidate in the Department of Political Science at the University of Toronto and the Asian Institute at the Munk Centre for International Studies will be joining CMSS in the fall of 2006 as a Research Associate. Her research focuses on genocide which is rooted in comparative politics and international relations theory and methodology. Ms. Hiebert will teach courses in the Department of Political Science and will augment the interdisciplinary nature of CMSS.

Maureen Shields, a future graduate of the Master of Strategic Studies program, will be joining CMSS beginning September 2006 as a Post-Masters Intern. Working with Dr. Herwig, she will continue her research on NORAD, specifically the future of Canada/US defence cooperation.

Collaboration

Closer collaboration resulted from the SDF conference in Calgary in November 2004 and Quebec City in October 2005 amongst faculty, administrators, and students.

On the U of C campus, the Centre continues its close cooperation with the Faculty of Social Sciences, the Faculty of Graduate Studies, and the Departments of History, Political Science, Anthropology, and Economics.

Cooperative relationships with the Royal Military College of Canada, the Canadian Forces Leadership Institute, DND Public Affairs and the US Consulate-General in Calgary continue to benefit both faculty and students.

The Centre is grateful for the guidance and support of its Advisory Council, Board of Directors, and Library Archives Advisory Board.

2006-2007 Priorities

In support of the University's strategic priority to "enlarge high-quality graduate programs, especially research-oriented doctoral programs that support our strategic priorities," graduate students remain a high priority for the Centre. Recruiting high quality students and establishing a competitive funding package is essential for elevating the Centre's profile as a leading Centre of Excellence in North America over the next five years.

Closer collaboration with CMSS Fellows, cooperation with RMC and other DND organizations, continues to be a priority for CMSS.

SDF Program Challenges

While CMSS received additional space in December 2006 for Ph.D. students and researchers, infrastructure remains a concern for future growth and collaboration.

The Arctic Shipping Conference, proposed by Dr. Huebert, to assess the nature of northern shipping and consider how Canada should prepare, did not come to fruition. Dr. Huebert is currently on sabbatical leave, January to June 2006.

In terms of the SDF Annual Report, media tracking continues to be time consuming and difficult. While we appreciate the clarification provided by SDF relating to the reporting of publications and outreach activities, the template is difficult to work with and format.

With the results of the renewal cycle for 2006-2011 pending, it has been challenging to move forward on new initiatives.

The University's transfer of administrative systems (Financial, Human Resources, Payroll, Materials Management) to PeopleSoft has been frustrating and challenging for University staff. It has been extremely difficult, if not impossible, to get precise budget figures from the University on a number of projects.

We have been asked to comment on the impact on activities if SDF funding were unavailable. The impact would be detrimental to the scholarly environment for graduate students and researchers. SDF funding directly supports graduate students to present their research at scholarly conferences, and in 2005/06 CMSS decided to provide \$15,000 in scholarship funding to CMSS students through SDF funding. SDF funds a portion of the administrative staff at the Centre and provides conference travel funds and thesis research awards to assist students in their academic careers.

Observations Concerning the 2005-2006 Annual Report

The CMSS faculty, staff, research associates, and students wish to acknowledge the ongoing support of the Department of National Defence, and particularly thank members of the office of the Directorate of Public Policy for their assistance.

We extend special recognition and appreciation for the international conference travel fund initiated by SDF in 2003-04. We very much hope the program will be continued, and possibly expanded, allowing graduate students and researchers affiliated with CMSS to network and present their research internationally. The expansion of the Special Projects fund will greatly assist CMSS and other Centres of Expertise in contributing to defence and security issues. We are appreciative of the efforts of SDF in preparing a regular newsletter and for bringing graduate students together for policy dialogues and SDF scholarship recognition.

We appreciate and recognize the work of the SDF Selection Committee members in reviewing and providing feedback on the annual reports. The research, teaching, outreach, and educational opportunities at SDF Centres across Canada contribute significantly to the debate on defence and security issues facing Canada. SDF funding and recognition of this work is paramount to the continuation of the program.

With closer relationships with the SDF program in Ottawa and other SDF Centres of Expertise, CMSS looks forward to being a leader in military, security and defence studies in the years ahead.

- disseminating the results of faculty and student research through electronic publication, support for conference participation, and through its website;
- collaborating with colleagues and programs at the U of C, with Canadian institutes and centres, with institutions abroad, with departments in the Canadian government, and with regional and international organizations.

- Defence economics
- Unconventional warfare (includes terrorism and counter insurgency)

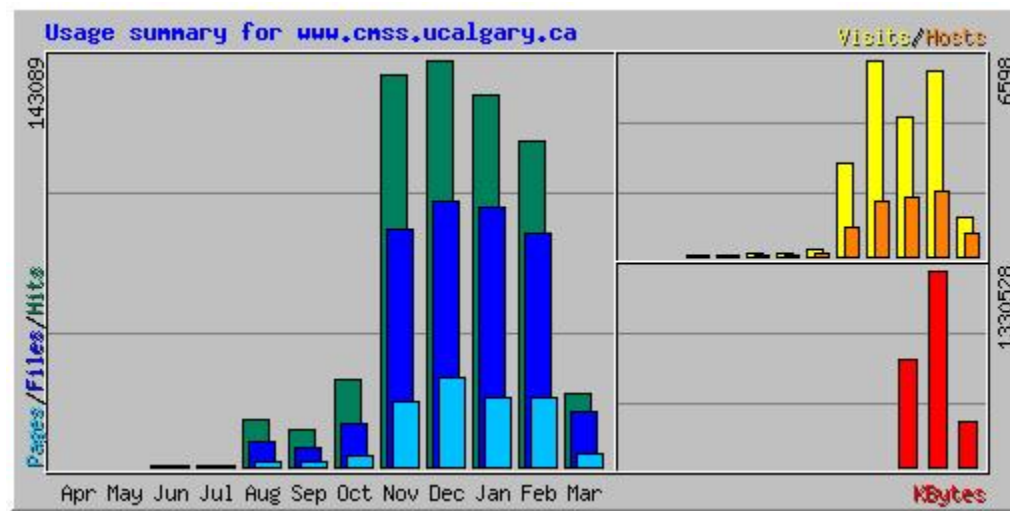

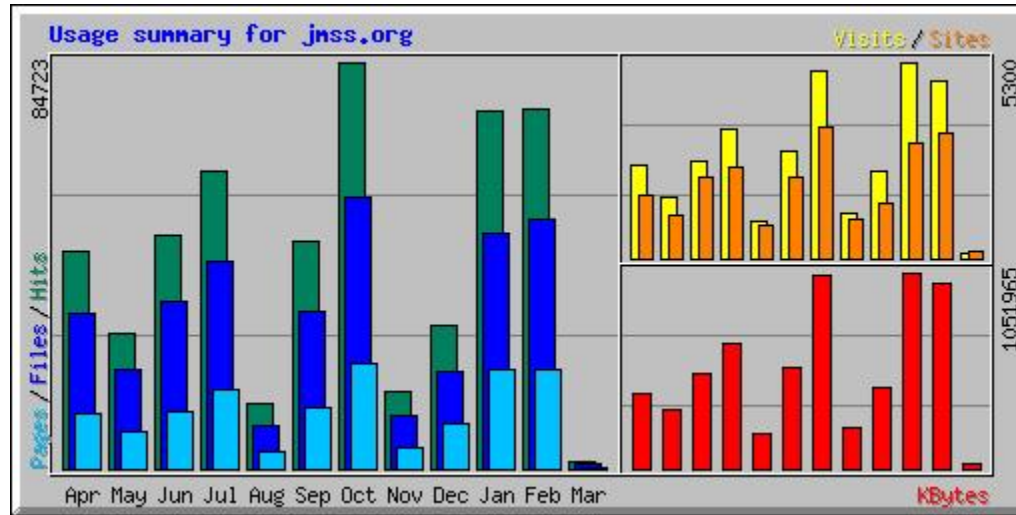

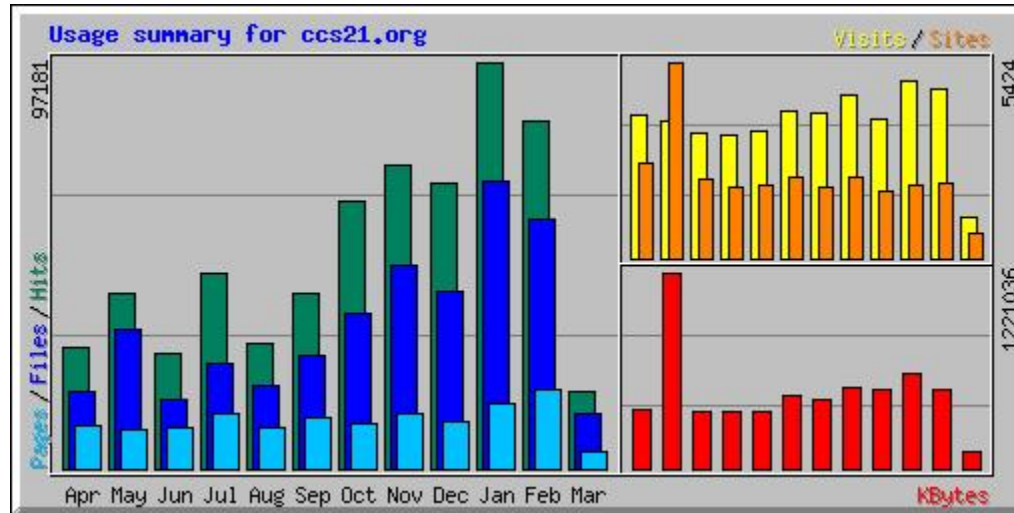
