Summary of Program Highlights

The Centre for Military and Strategic Studies (CMSS) Security and Defence Forum (SDF) Program at the University of Calgary (U of C) remains committed to promoting and developing excellence in military, security and defence studies, and elevating its profile as a leading Centre of Excellence in North America.

The Centre remains committed to the promotion of advanced research, teaching and outreach, and nurtures a healthy interest in security and defence-related issues among Canadian students as well as in the general public.

The University has a strong interest in military, security and defence studies, as evidenced by the faculty, staff, students, and course offerings at the University, the institutionalization and integration of the research, teaching, and public education activities within the University, and the degree to which the University provides salaries, benefits, space, administrative support, and library resources in support of the Centre.

The following highlights for the 2007-2008 program year deserve recognition.

Engagement of Faculty and Students in SDF Program Activities

The number of U of C students and faculty directly engaged in SDF activities continues to expand. Course offerings and enrollments at both the undergraduate and graduate levels remain high.

CMSS graduated 7 Master of Strategic Studies (MSS) students in 2007-08. Graduates have accepted positions in government and industry relating to security and defence. As of March 2008, CMSS has 26 MSS students and 10 special case PhD students. Each of our students has a diverse background ranging from Political Science to History to Anthropology. Admission offers for September 2008 have been made to twelve outstanding MSS applicants and one PhD applicant.

The Centre continued its support of graduate and undergraduate research assistants and its support of student activities. The Centre was pleased to continue its support of the Calgary Model United Nations Team (UCMUNT) and the 10th Anniversary Strategic Studies Student Conference, "Globalized Conflict: Strategy and Security Challenges of the Past, Present, and Future: *War and Security: The Costs of Conflict.*"

As noted last year, the Centre appointed Dr. Hrach Gregorian, President, Institute of World Affairs, and Lara Olson, University of Calgary as Co-Directors of the Peacebuilding, Development and Security Program within the Centre. A seminar series, "New Challenges in War to Peace Transitions" was introduced, along with research and writing activities.

With the addition last year of John Wright, Military and Strategic Studies Librarian/Archivist, the Centre continued to strengthen its relationship with the University of Calgary Library and the Calgary Military Museums, supporting students, researchers and the general public.

Dr. Mike McKee, Arthur Child Chair in Defence Economics, resigned from the University effective July 2007. Following extensive consultation, a Chair in American Security Policy in the

Department of Political Science and the Centre for Military and Strategic Studies was created. Dr. Terry Terriff has been selected to fill the position and will join the University on July 1, 2008. His research interests include American government and American security policy. He has published widely on change in military organization, NATO and European security, and international peacekeeping.

Dr. Holger Herwig, Canada Research Chair in Military and Strategic Studies, has been awarded a seven-year Chair renewal beginning July 1, 2008. Dr. Herwig contributes research funds annually to support CMSS graduate students.

SDF Program Highlights, 2007 – 2008

The renewal of the five year SDF grant in 2007 greatly assisted the Centre in building upon its strengths and existing expertise.

Funding

As indicated in last year's annual report, external donations to CMSS have provided funding in support of graduate students through the creation of CDFAI/Child Memorial Doctoral and Masters scholarships.

With the increased SDF grant, graduate student support for the MSS program and special case Ph.D. program was enhanced, along with new course offerings, including military anthropology, unconventional warfare, and domestic and hemispheric security. The MSS Co-op proposal has been approved by the University and CMSS will be recruiting students for this program over the next year. A formal PhD program proposal has been approved by various University committees and is being forwarded to the provincial government for final approval and endorsement.

The Centre's budget for 2007-08 totalled \$1 million. Graduate students were awarded more than \$300,000 in scholarship and research awards. Funding from SDF, the University of Calgary, donations, and conference support, allowed the Centre to focus on teaching, research, and outreach activities.

Funding priorities for 2008-09 include publications, collaborative research projects, and increased funding for graduate students, including research support and travel stipends.

Curriculum Development

Over the 2007-08 program year, CMSS held three block week courses to enhance its course offerings. Dr. Joel Sokolsky from the Royal Military College of Canada taught *United States Strategic Studies* in the winter term, while Dr. Michael Epkenhans of the Otto-von-Bismark Foundation in Germany for Global Developments taught *Sea Power*, and Dr. Saul Shay of Bar Ilan University in Israel taught *States and Terrorism* in the fall term, in collaboration with the Israeli Studies Program.

A block week course has been approved for 2009, *Relief, Development and Security: The Challenges of Coordination in International Peacebuilding Missions*, to be co-taught by Dr. Hrach Gregorian and Lara Olson.

Students

Graduate students remain a high priority for the Centre, both in terms of providing competitive funding packages and opportunities for conference participation and research travel.

Seven graduate students completed their program in the 2007-08 program year bringing the total number of MSS alumni to 36. The Centre encourages alumnus to keep in touch with CMSS and updates are posted on the alumni section of the CMSS website.

Publications

The Centre's faculty, research associates and graduate students sustained a strong publication record in 2007-08, publishing in more than fifty academic and scholarly journals and academic and private presses.

The electronic journal, *Journal of Military and Strategic Studies*, continued to receive increased attention. Published quarterly, the electronic journal is dedicated to the study of contemporary Canadian strategic policy and security-related issues.

To enhance awareness of security and defence issues among the general public and to contribute to the public policy debates and public education on defence and security issues, the Centre launched a publication series, *Calgary Papers in Military and Strategic Studies*, under the direction of Dr. John Ferris. Two volumes on *Canada in Kandahar* and *Canadian Defence Policy* were published in 2007, and an Occasional Paper by Adam Lajeunesse, *Lock, Stock and Icebergs: Defining Canadian Sovereignty from Mackenzie King to Stephen Harper*, was released in January 2008.

Conferences and Events

The Centre sustained its organization and sponsorship with SDF support of over forty lectures and seminars. Centre associates participated in more than sixty relevant conferences, workshops, seminars, and political meetings.

In September 2007 the Centre was pleased to participate in the fourth annual SDF Conference, held in Ottawa, Ontario, and looks forward to future conferences hosted by other SDF Centres.

Collaboration with the Canadian Forces Leadership Institute resulted in a successful conference held in January 2008, focusing on the significant headway made by the Department of National Defence and Canadian Forces (DND/CF) in implementing the various recommendations contained in the Young Report and how such reforms have contributed to the operational success of the CF in the new security environment.

New Initiatives

The **Peacebuilding, Development and Security Program** (PDSP) was established last year in partnership between CMSS and the Institute of World Affairs in Washington, D.C. The PDSP's mission includes the fostering of both practitioner-focused and scholarly research along with interagency and civil-military dialogue in order to improve the practice, and ultimately the effectiveness, of international assistance to conflict-affected countries. CMSS will continue to provide funding for this initiative. For further information, visit <http://www.ucalgary.ca/pdsp/>.

The Centre is participating in **Canada's World**, a three-year citizens' dialogue focused on advancing a new vision for Canadian international policy. The aim of Canada's World is to engage Canadians in creating a new narrative for Canadian international policy.

The Centre will be offering **Resident Fellowships** on a competitive basis to fellows with heavy teaching and/or administrative loads. Resident fellows will be expected to participate in Centre sponsored events and to deliver at least one public lecture to disseminate their research.

New **Research Funding** will be available on a competitive basis to fellows and graduate students to support collaborative research projects that fit within the Centre's broad spectrum of research interests.

Collaboration

On the U of C campus, the Centre continues its close cooperation with the Faculty of Social Sciences, the Faculty of Graduate Studies, and the Departments of History, Political Science, Anthropology, the Israeli Studies Program, the Schulich School of Engineering, and the Arctic Institute of North America.

Cooperative relationships with the Royal Military College of Canada, the Canadian Forces Leadership Institute, DND Public Affairs, the U.S. Consulate-General in Calgary, and other SDF Centres continue to benefit both faculty and students.

The Centre is formally exploring academic cooperation with the Helmut Schmidt University, University of the Federal Armed Forces Hamburg in Germany. Leutnant Christian Mattern, a political science student and active army officer of the Bundeswehr visited Calgary as a research associate from September 2007 to January 2008.

2007-2008 Priorities

In support of the University's strategic priority to "enlarge high-quality graduate programs, especially research-oriented doctoral programs that support our strategic priorities," graduate students remain a high priority for the Centre. Recruiting high quality students and establishing a competitive funding package is essential for elevating the Centre's profile as a leading Centre of Excellence in North America. Funding available through the SDF International and National Conference Fund assists considerably in recruiting top-quality graduate students.

Closer collaboration with CMSS Fellows, cooperation with RMC and other DND organizations, continues to be a priority for CMSS.

CMSS will be hosting a conference ***Preparing for the Next Century of Canadian Sea Power*** from September 7-10, 2008 in Calgary. Further details will be posted on the CMSS website as they become available.

We have been asked to comment on the impact on activities if SDF funding were unavailable. As stated previously, the impact would be extremely detrimental to the scholarly environment for graduate students and researchers. SDF funding directly supports graduate students to present their research at scholarly conferences, and two years ago, CMSS decided to dedicate \$15,000 annually in scholarship funding to CMSS students through SDF funding. SDF funds a portion of the administrative staff at the Centre and provides conference travel funds and thesis research awards to assist students in their academic careers.

Observations

The CMSS faculty, staff, research associates, and students wish to acknowledge the ongoing support of the Department of National Defence, and particularly thank members of the office of the Directorate of Public Policy for their assistance. We are appreciative of the efforts of SDF in preparing a regular newsletter and for bringing graduate students together for policy dialogues and SDF scholarship recognition.

We appreciate and recognize the work of the SDF Selection Committee members in reviewing and providing feedback on the annual reports. The research, teaching, outreach, and educational opportunities at SDF Centres across Canada contribute significantly to the debate on defence and security issues facing Canada. SDF funding and recognition of this work is paramount to the continuation of the program.

As noted last year, professors at the University of Calgary are no longer required to complete annual reports for the University and, as such, gathering information for the SDF annual report has proven more difficult.

With closer relationships with the SDF program in Ottawa and other SDF Centres of Expertise, CMSS looks forward to being a leader in military, security and defence studies in the years ahead.

Introductory Section One – Mission Statement

What is the Centre's mission statement?

The Centre for Military and Strategic Studies (CMSS) is a research institute within the Faculty of Social Sciences at the University of Calgary (U of C) and has been identified as a Pillar of Prominence at the U of C. Its purpose is to promote and develop excellence in military, security and defence studies. The Centre seeks to advance this mandate by:

- coordinating research programs relevant to international and national policy makers relating to military, security and defence issues;
- fostering informed debate through the organization of conferences, workshops and seminars that bring together academics, students, experts, policy makers, and the general public;
- providing educational opportunities for students through the Master of Strategic Studies (MSS) program, special case Ph.D. program and MSS Co-op program;
- providing opportunities for graduate and undergraduate students to advance their careers through engagement in research in a challenging and productive environment;
- disseminating the results of faculty and student research through electronic publication, support for conference participation, and through its website;
- collaborating with colleagues and programs at the U of C, with Canadian institutes and centres, with institutions abroad, with departments in the Canadian government, and with regional and international organizations.

The Centre's major research foci are:

- Canadian military studies
- Civil-military relations
- Peacebuilding, development and security
- Unconventional warfare (includes terrorism and counter insurgency)
- Domestic/hemispheric security
- Ethics and morality in conflict
- Seapower/naval history
- Arctic security
- Strategic thought
- Israeli security studies
- Military anthropology
- American security studies

The Director of the Centre is Dr. David Bercuson who works closely with Dr. Rob Huebert, Associate Director, Dr. Holger Herwig, Canada Research Chair in Military and Strategic Studies, and Dr. Patrick H. Brennan, Graduate Program Coordinator.

The Centre is committed to its vision and program of activities, fostering closer working relationships with other SDF Centres and working in partnership with the Canadian Defence & Foreign Affairs Institute (CDFAI) and the Arthur J.E. Child Foundation.

What is the relationship between the mission statement and the activities of the SDF Centre?

The Centre seeks to advance the study and understanding of military, security and defence issues through the following activities:

- curriculum development and teaching in support of the Master of Strategic Studies (MSS) program, Master of Strategic Studies (MSS) Co-op program, and the special case PhD program;
- support for research, across disciplines, relevant to military, security and defence studies;
- encouragement of informed scholarly and public debate on military, security and defence studies;
- organization of conferences, lectures and seminars;
- participation in academic and public meetings to promote high quality, policy-relevant research;
- dissemination of information and materials to the academic and attentive public communities in Canada and abroad regarding military, security and defence issues; and,
- cooperation and coordination with university, government, non-governmental, and private sector partners to broaden perspectives, share resources, and advance policy-relevant research and debate.

How do the activities undertaken in the current fiscal year match with those in the original five-year funding proposal?

The following activities were undertaken in the 2007-2008 program year:

- **Major Themes of Research and Program Activities**
 - Canadian military, security and defence issues – organization of, and participation in (on and off campus), numerous lectures, seminars, conferences; support for faculty and graduate student research on defence and security issues.
 - Organization of the conference: *Forced to Change: Education and Reform 10 Years After*, in January 2008 in collaboration with the Canadian Forces Leadership Institute.
- **Engagement of students and support of student activities**
 - Support for graduate students: SDF funding support for teaching assistantships, research assistantships, scholarships, plus travel and related support for thesis research and conference participation;
 - Support for undergraduate and graduate students to support scholarly research activities.
 - Funding to support the 10th Anniversary Strategic Studies Student Conference, “Globalized Conflict: Strategy and Security Challenges of the Past, Present, and Future: *War and Security: The Costs of Conflict.*”

- **Enhanced cooperation with other Institutes, on and off campus**
 - Canadian Defence and Foreign Affairs Institute (CDFAI) – Sponsorship of the Canadian Military Journalism course; scholarships for Masters and PhD students;
 - Centre for Information Security and Cryptography – co-sponsors of monthly lectures on defence and security;
 - Department of National Defence, Royal Military College of Canada and other SDF Centres and military organizations.
- **CMSS Publication Series**
 - To further its mission of public education and shaping the debate on Canadian military and foreign policy, and strategic studies in general, CMSS established a publication series, *Calgary Papers in Military and Strategic Studies*, under the direction of Dr. John Ferris, series editor. The series will augment and extend its present form of electronic publication.
- **Peacebuilding, Development and Security Program**
 - Under the direction of Dr. Hrach Gregorian and Lara Olson, the Centre established the Peacebuilding, Development and Security Program (PDSP). Four programs serve as the major pillars of PDSP: research on policy and practice; practitioner dialogues and workshops; curriculum development and instruction for advanced graduate students, including practicums in applied settings; and trainings in best practices.

What activities are planned for next year? How do they match the original five-year funding proposal?

For the 2008-09 program year, the following activities are planned:

- **Major Themes of Research and Program Activities**
 - **Graduate Program**
 - Increased support for graduate students, including scholarships, assistantships, conference and research support;
 - Establish a formal PhD program, offering competitive funding packages for recruitment;
 - Market and recruit students for the newly established MSS Co-op program.
 - **Publications**
 - Support for the *Journal of Military and Strategic Studies*, JMSS, an electronic journal focusing on contemporary Canadian strategic policy;
 - Support for research assistants;
 - Support for the *Calgary Papers in Military and Strategic Studies*.
 - Support for the *Canadian Defence Annual*, a new annual publication on Canadian Defence and Security Policy.
 - **Annual Ross Ellis Memorial Lecture Series in Military and Strategic Studies**
 - This lecture series honors Lt. Colonel Ross Ellis (1915-1983), Commander of the Calgary Highlanders. Dedicated to his leadership abilities and military spirit, the series brings a renowned specialist in military and strategic studies to speak to the University community and general public. The 2008 lecture will be held on April 17,

2008, featuring Professor Terry Copp, "Canada's National Army, Canada's National Interest: 1918-2008".

- Canadian Military Journalism Course
 - A ten day scholarship program for journalism students, sponsored by the Canadian Defence & Foreign Affairs Institute, hosted by CMSS adjunct assistant professor and graduate, Dr. Bob Bergen (May 2008).
- **Engagement of students and support of student activities**
 - Postdoctoral Fellowship Program: Host one Post-Doctoral Fellow, sponsored by CMSS; J.L. Granatstein Post-Doctoral Fellowship;
 - Support for graduate students: travel and related support for thesis research and conference participation; research associate stipends;
 - Provide support for the 11th Annual Student Conference (2009);
- **Enhanced cooperation with other Institutes**
 - **Helmut Schmidt University, University of the Federal Armed Forces Hamburg in Germany** – Educational opportunities and partnerships in cooperation with Helmut Schmidt University.
 - **Royal Military College of Canada** - Educational opportunities and partnerships in cooperation with RMC.
 - **Canadian Forces Leadership Institute** - Educational opportunities and partnerships in cooperation with CFLI.
- **Outreach and Dissemination of SDF Program Output**
 - Enhanced advertising campaign; increase CMSS profile in the media;
 - Increase numbers of high quality graduate students;

 - Sustain cooperation with DND Public Affairs.
