Summary of Program Highlights

The following highlights of the Centre for Military and Strategic Studies (CMSS) Security and Defence Forum (SDF) Program at the University of Calgary for the 2003-04 program year deserve recognition.

Overall University Context and Support

The University of Calgary (U of C) continues to support the Centre, with significant additional funding assistance in 2003-04 for graduate students, administrative support, and infrastructure support. Special thanks to the Faculty of Social Sciences, Faculty of Graduate Studies, the President's Office, and Campus Infrastructure.

In 2002 the U of C adopted a new Academic Plan, which identified areas of international prominence, "research and programs in military history, strategic studies, and international relations" being one of them. "Strategic and international relations" was further identified as a pillar of prominence at the U of C. With the strong support of the Faculty of Social Sciences, substantial funding was allocated to CMSS in recognition of its accomplishments. Core funding was secured for administrative support, operating expenses, and graduate student funding. Two faculty positions in military history and strategic and international relations were created to sustain and build the public policy area at a world-class level. The successful candidate in political science will contribute to the interdisciplinary program in international relations and contribute to teaching and research associated with the MSS program. The successful history candidate will be involved in the graduate program in military history and maintain an active research program. Funding was also secured for a sessional position in military anthropology.

While CMSS underwent physical space renovations in August 2002, thanks to a Canada Foundation for Innovation grant from Dr. Holger Herwig, which resulted in substantially better facilities for SDF related activities--seminars, workshops, research space for fellows and research assistants--the U of C has provided CMSS with top-quality, newly renovated and expanded facilities for CMSS. Significant funding was awarded to the Centre, providing outstanding facilities for fellows, research associates, staff, and graduate students. CMSS is extremely grateful to the University for its strong support of the Centre.

Engagement of Faculty and Students in SDF Program Activities

The number of U of C students and faculty directly engaged in SDF activities continues to expand. Course offerings and enrolments at both the undergraduate and graduate levels remain high.

The Centre continued its support for graduate and undergraduate research assistants and its support of student activities. During the 2003-04 program year, 8 core faculty, 5 research associates, and 32 graduate students were engaged in SDF program activities. Graduate student applications for both the Master of Strategic Studies (MSS) and special-case PhD programs increased significantly. The Centre was pleased to continue its support of the Society for Military and Strategic Studies (SMSS) and its 6th Annual Conference, and the Calgary Model United Nations Team (UCMUNT).

Faculty Highlights, 2003-04

The Centre's Director, David Bercuson, continues to provide outstanding scholarly expertise on Canadian military history and Canadian defence studies. The Centre is extremely proud of Bercuson's appointment as an Officer of the Order of Canada (OC), recognizing his outstanding contributions to education. Bercuson concluded his role as a Member of the Minister of National Defence's Committee to Monitor Reserve Restructure and Leadership in the Canadian Forces. Bercuson took a well-deserved sabbatical in the winter 2004 term, completing research and writing of a manuscript with Holger Herwig, *Christmas in Washington: Roosevelt, Churchill and the Forging of the Grand Alliance*, to be published in London, New York, and Toronto in the fall 2004.

The Centre's Associate Director, Rob Huebert, was appointed President of the Canadian Consortium on Asia Pacific Security (CANCAPS) and hosted the 11th annual conference in Calgary in December 2003. His scholarly accomplishments were noted in *Canadian Who's Who*, published by the University of Toronto Press. His research on the Canadian North received notable recognition, and Huebert was invited to appear before the Liberal Foreign Affairs Caucus to comment on issues confronting Canadian northern sovereignty and security.

Holger Herwig, Canada Research Chair in Military and Strategic Studies, was honoured in 2003 at the unveiling of the Prisoners of War Memorial at Hendon near Lancaster on 14 May. Honourable Prince Philip, the Duke of Edinburgh, unveiled a sculpture that modelled the image of the PoW marching out of Stalag Luft III from the documentary, "Forced March to Freedom," by Herwig and Bercuson. The documentary was shown on History Television. A public showing of the German-language version of "James Cameron's Expedition Bismarck" in Germany in October 2003 was another highlight of Herwig's international prominence.

James Keeley, long-time resident fellow of CMSS and co-editor of the *Journal of Military and Strategic Studies*, continues his research on nuclear non-proliferation, completing a 2003 list of bilateral civil nuclear cooperation agreements that was presented to the Treaty Research Center at the University of Washington and to the Center for Non-proliferation Studies at the Monterey Institute of International Studies in California. Keeley is a key member of the Centre's executive team, spearheading the transition of the Centre's high school curriculum Weblearn program.

John Ferris, an expert on military and security affairs, defence policy, and signals intelligence, continued to serve as co-editor of the *Journal of Military and Strategic Studies*. Ferris remains an active member of the Centre, contributing internationally to the security and intelligence field.

Barry Cooper, a senior fellow focusing on Canadian public policy, media, and terrorism, is a member of several national and international societies and associations and is a Senior Fellow with the Fraser Institute. While Cooper was on sabbatical in the fall 2003, he continued his association with the *Calgary Herald* and other Can West Global publications, highlighting a series of articles during the Iraq conflict.

Pat Brennan, a military-diplomatic historian, was appointed full-time in the History Department and enjoyed a six-month sabbatical leave, researching in England in the fall 2003. He gave several well-attended public lectures at the Museum of the Regiments and will be serving as Graduate Coordinator in CMSS effective July 2004.

David Wright, assistant professor of history, joined the CMSS Executive team in 2003 and was elected fellow of the Royal Asiatic Society of Great Britain and Ireland. He won a distinguished teaching award from the University and presented at an international conference in Turkey thanks to the SDF international conference fund.

SDF Program Highlights, 2003-04

SDF policy research continued to focus on Canadian security and defence policy, regional security issues and their implications for Canada, and circumpolar security issues. A highlight was the increased attention the Centre continued to receive for its scholarly work on Canadian security issues by both the local and national media.

The Centre sustained and continued to attract external resources in support of its activities: E-learning, the *Journal of Military and Strategic Studies*, and the Ross Ellis Memorial Lecture in Military and Strategic Studies, sponsored by the Canadian Defence and Foreign Affairs Institute (CDFAI), and SDF special project grants in support of the 11th annual CANCAPS conference and the 6th annual SMSS conference.

The Centre sustained and expanded its organization and sponsorship with SDF support for more than 30 lectures and seminars. Centre associates participated in more than 50 relevant conferences, workshops, seminars, and political meetings in Canada and abroad.

During 2003-04, the Centre was active in organizing an international conference on Homeland Defence and Land Force Reserves, in collaboration with the Canadian Defence and Foreign Affairs Institute and the Project Management Office (PMO) of the Land Forces Reserves Restructuring (LFRR), Canadian Army to be held in Calgary, March 25-27, 2004. The 2004 International Reserves Conference will follow on the tremendous success of the March 2002 conference, "Bridging the Gap: Reserve Forces & the Role of Civil Society". The 2004 conference will examine, "What is the best way to structure, train, and deploy land force reserves for homeland defence?", with experts from the Canadian Army, the Australian Army, the British Army, the United States' Army Reserves, Army National Guard, and Marine Force Reserves.

The Centre's faculty, research associates and graduate students sustained a strong publication record for 2003-04, publishing in academic and scholarly journals and academic and private presses.

The Centre graduated 3 Masters students and its first PhD student during 2003-2004. As of January 2004, the Centre has 2 special case PhD students, and 32 Masters students with diverse backgrounds in history, political science, military engineering, mechanical engineering, and law. Offers of admission to 12 applicants have been made to date for the Fall term 2004.

On the U of C campus, the Centre continues its close cooperation with the Faculty of Social Sciences, the Faculty of Graduate Studies, the Department of History, the Department of Political Science, and the Arctic Institute of North America.

The Centre has ongoing relationships with its counterparts at Manitoba and Dalhousie through its role in the Council for Canadian Security in the 21st Century (CCS 21).

Cooperative relationships with DND Public Affairs and the US Consulate General in Calgary were continued at high levels of activity, benefiting both faculty and students.

The Centre had over two million hits to its website in 2003-2004. The *Journal of Military and Strategic Studies* and the Council for Canadian Security in the 21st Century continued to receive increasing attention.

The Centre received over 60 new and continuing grants in 2003-2004, totalling over \$1.4 million in support of graduate students, conferences, and research and program activities.

The Centre extends its thanks to the Canadian Defence and Foreign Affairs Institute (CDFAI) for its continued support and sponsorship of the Centre's activities.

The Centre is grateful for the guidance and support of its Advisory Council, Board of Directors, and the Library Archives Advisory Board.

New Initiatives

The Centre is excited about a new initiative to organize and host an SDF conference in Calgary in late October, early November 2004, which will bring together the SDF community across the country and will highlight research on the state of strategic studies in Canada today. We hope that the SDF conference will provide an opportunity for Centres to network, share ideas, and collaborate on research and educational initiatives. We further envision that an annual conference be held, hosted by other SDF centres. CMSS plans to publish the conference proceedings electronically, increasing awareness of the current academic research in the security and defence field. To accomplish our goals, CMSS will establish a Conference Committee with representation from other SDF centres.

SDF Program Challenges

While the CMSS website and activities continue to expand, CMSS, in cooperation with the Canadian Defence and Foreign Affairs Institute (CDFAI), had initiated a review of the High School curriculum Weblearn program. A high school expert has been contracted to examine the current effectiveness and future potential of the project. CMSS will explore various options and future direction of the Weblearn program in the coming year.

Observations Concerning the 2003-04 Annual Report

The CMSS faculty, staff, research associates and students wish to acknowledge the ongoing support of the Department of National Defence, and particularly to thank members of the office of the Directorate of Public Policy for their assistance.

Special recognition and appreciation is merited on the international conference travel fund initiated by SDF in 2003-04. While CMSS research associates benefited from this additional funding, further travel is planned for the promotion of research on military, security, and defence studies in the 2004-05 program year.

We appreciate and recognize the work of the SDF Selection Committee members in reviewing and providing feedback on the annual reports and look forward to another productive year in 2004-05.

1.1	What is the Centre’s mission statement?
	<p>The Centre for Military and Strategic Studies (CMSS) is a research institute within the Faculty of Social Sciences at the University of Calgary (U of C) and has been identified as a pillar of prominence at the U of C. Its purpose is to promote and develop excellence in military, security and defence studies from a Canadian and international perspective. The Centre seeks to advance this mandate by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• coordinating research programs relevant to international and national policy makers relating to military, security and defence issues;• fostering informed debate through the organization of conferences, workshops, and seminars that bring together academics, students, experts, policy makers and the general public;• providing educational opportunities for students through the Master of Strategic Studies (MSS) program, special case PhD program, and a proposed Co-op MSS program in collaboration with the Canadian Defence Industries Association;• providing opportunities for graduate and undergraduate students to advance their careers through engagement in research in a challenging and productive environment;• disseminating the results of faculty and student research through electronic publication, support for conference participation, and through its website; and• collaborating with colleagues and programs at the U of C, with Canadian institutes and centres, with institutions abroad, with departments in Canadian government, and with regional and international organizations. <p>The Centre’s major foci are on issues concerning military history and security, Canadian foreign and defence policy, and circumpolar issues.</p> <p>The Director of the Centre is Dr. David Bercuson, who works closely with Dr. Rob Huebert, Associate Director (Acting Director January to June 2004), and Dr. Holger Herwig, Canada Research Chair in Military and Strategic Studies.</p> <p>The Centre continues to expand its vision and program of activities through closer working relationships with other SDF programs, U of C departments and faculties, and in partnership with the Canadian Defence and Foreign Affairs Institute (CDFAI).</p>

1.2	What is the relationship between the mission statement and the activities of the SDF Centre?
	<p>The Centre for Military and Strategic Studies (formerly Strategic Studies Program) has grown considerably under the Directorship of Dr. David J. Bercuson, OC. The Centre seeks to advance the study and understanding of military, security and defence issues through the following activities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • curriculum development and teaching in support of the Master of Strategic Studies (MSS) program; • support for research, across disciplines, relevant to military, security and defence studies; • encouragement of informed scholarly and public debate on military, security, and defence issues; • organization of conferences, lectures, and seminars; • participation in academic and public meetings to promote high quality, policy-relevant research; • dissemination of information and materials to the academic and attentive public communities in Canada and abroad regarding military, security and defence issues; and, • cooperation and coordination with university, government, non-governmental, and private sector partners to broaden perspectives, share resources, and advance policy-relevant research and debate.
1.3	Describe briefly the regional and linguistic importance of the Centre/Chair and, where applicable, the importance of the Centre/Chair activities to various cultural communities?
	<p>U of C is one of Canada's primary research universities, its library and facilities serving as a resource for students and scholars throughout Alberta. The Faculty of Social Sciences has ranked public policy and public affairs, specifically military and strategic studies, as its top priority in the area of research prominence. The Centre has benefited from the maintenance of a strong faculty with international expertise on military, political and security issues in Political Science, History, and Law, from collaboration with the Museum of the Regiments Library & Archives and support and guidance from its Advisory Council and Board.</p> <p>The U of C has experienced substantial growth over the past five years, absorbing more than 26% of the total growth in the post-secondary system in Alberta. The high level of interest shown by students in the fields of international relations and strategic studies continues to be a highlight.</p> <p>Over the last several years, U of C has been able to move forward on a number of important new initiatives relevant to the Centre and its SDF Program. These include: the establishment of an Israeli Studies Program with an endowment commitment from the Kahanoff Foundation, the significant investment of funding to the Centre to provide top-quality, newly renovated and expanded facilities, and the increased graduate funding available to students in the MSS program.</p>
1.4	How do the activities you've undertaken in the current fiscal year match what you undertook to do in your funding proposal?
	<p>The following activities were undertaken in the 2003-04 SDF program year:</p>

- **Major Themes of Research and Program Activities**

- **Canadian military, security and defence issues**—organization of, and participation in (on and off campus), numerous lectures, seminars, conferences; support for faculty and graduate student research on defence and security issues.
- **Regional Security Issues** and the Implications for Canada
 - Asia Pacific – organized the 11th annual CANCAPS conference.
- **Weblearn - E-learning**, “Beyond High School Textbooks to E-learning: A Website for Teachers and Students”
 - In partnership with the Canadian Defence and Foreign Affairs Institute (CDFAI), and in collaboration with the Calgary Catholic School District and the Calgary Board of Education, CMSS provided web based curriculum materials to students and teachers to assist in learning about Canada’s place in the international community and how our identity as a nation is shaped by past and present events. The program is being evaluated for its effectiveness and future direction.
- **Israeli Studies Specialization**
 - In cooperation with the Kahanoff Chair in Israeli Studies, expansion of course offerings on military ethics;
 - Further opportunities to work with and to supervise graduate students.

- **Engagement of Students and Support of Student Activities**

- Support for graduate students: SDF funding support for teaching assistants, research assistantships, plus travel and related support for thesis research and conference participation;
- Support for undergraduate students
 - SDF funding to support activities of SMSS students to attend conferences and assist with research travel costs;
 - SDF funding to support the SMSS 6th Annual Student Conference on *War and Security*.

- **Enhanced Cooperation with other Institutes, on and off campus**

- Canadian Defence and Foreign Affairs Institute (CDFAI); co-sponsorship of the *Journal of Military and Strategic Studies*, the Ross Ellis Memorial Lecture in Military and Strategic Studies, and the *E-learning* curriculum development educational project;
- Museum of the Regiments – Military Library and Archives: co-sponsorship of Librarian/Archivist; lectures and seminars concerning military, security and defence issues;
- DEW Line to Sea Lane – Research project collaboration; Arctic Institute of North America, U of C.

- **Administrative Changes**

Relocation and renovations of the Centre facilities, funded by the U of C and a Canada Foundation for Innovation infrastructure grant awarded to Dr. Herwig, Canada Research Chair. The new facilities and computer upgrades have resulted in:

- Top-quality, newly renovated and expanded facilities for SDF workshops, lectures, research assistant work space, and office space for graduate students;
- More efficient integration of administrative services and staffing.

- **Note:** With the newly renovated and expanded facilities, CMSS plans to host two visiting scholars during 2004-05.

- **Enhanced Cooperation with other Institutes, on and off campus**

- **SDF Conference** – CMSS plans to organize an SDF conference, “Defence and Security Studies in Canada Today”, to bring together academics, administrative assistants, students, postdoctoral fellows, and researchers from the SDF community to further promote security and defence related issues.
- **Council for Canadian Security in the 21st Century** - The Council for Canadian Security in the 21st Century (CCS21) is a broad-based national organization that encourages Canadians and their government to provide adequate numbers of well-equipped, well-trained Regular and Reserve military forces to protect Canada’s interests. Key objectives include non-partisan participation in public debate about defence through preparation of reports and articles for circulation to government, media and the interested public. Under the direction of Dr. J. L. Granatstein, Chair of CCS21, membership has expanded from a founding group of 60 members in November 2001 to over 1000 members.
- **Ocean Management Research Network Initiative (OMRN)** – OMRN is a national network of individuals interested in and doing research on oceans and coastal management and policy. The OMRN provides a forum for the discussion and evaluation of our current state knowledge. It supports the creativity and innovation needed for the application of critical thinking on ocean and coastal research leading to the healthy management of marine communities. The OMRN is supported by a joint strategic grant provided by SSHRC and the Department of Fisheries and Oceans. It is a multi-year initiative that includes researchers from academy, government and NGOs from across Canada.
- **ArcticNet** – CMSS, in partnership with the Arctic Institute of North America (AINA), is a principal investigator in the ArcticNet research program. ArcticNet is a cross-disciplinary, multi-million dollar program to examine the impact of climate change in the Canadian Arctic. ArcticNet connects well-established Centres of Excellence in the natural, medical and social sciences, and their partners in northern communities, federal and provincial agencies and the private sector to study the impacts of climate change in the Arctic. ArcticNet researchers collaborate with the best research teams in the USA, Japan, Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Poland, the United Kingdom, Spain and Belgium. ArcticNet will contribute the knowledge needed to formulate impact assessments, national policies and adaptation strategies to help Canada face the environmental and socio-economic consequences of an Arctic meltdown. The direct involvement of northerners in the scientific process is a primary goal of the network. ArcticNet will provide a unique multidisciplinary cross-sector environment of the next generation of scientists and northerners-something that is urgently needed to ensure the stewardship of a new Canadian Arctic. CMSS is responsible for examining the impact of climate change on Canadian Arctic sovereignty and security.

 - Dr. Joerg Echternkamp, invited as an international visiting professor, summer 2004, from the Military Research Institute in Potsdam, social and cultural interrelation of war and society;
 - Continued support of Israeli Studies Program; block courses;
 - Dr. Ren Haiping, Chinese Academy of Social Sciences, invited as an international visiting professor, summer 2004, lectures and research, researching military technology, economy, finance, and diplomacy.

- **SDF Conference**; bringing together faculty, researchers, students, staff, and policy makers, highlighting the state of security and defence studies in Canada today, October/November 2004.

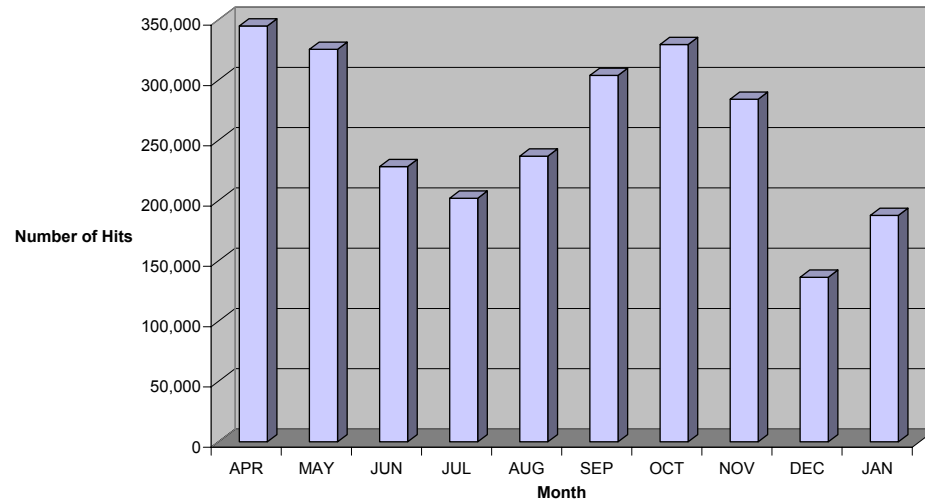

Sessions by Geographic Network Location

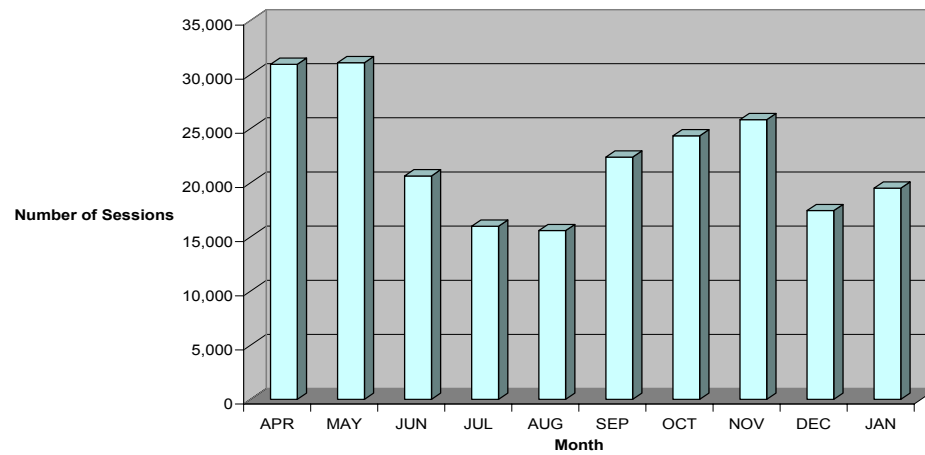

Council for Canadian Security in the 21st Century (CCS21)

Initially organized by a group of concerned Canadians, CCS21 produced a report entitled, “To Secure a Nation” in November 2001 which urged the Government to undertake a full Defence and Security Review. The campaign to expand the membership of the advocacy group began in April 2002 through invitations by mail, a media awareness drive, public meetings, and the creation of a website, www.ccs21.org. CCS21 currently has 1062 members, an increase of 25% over the previous year. Efforts to expand its membership are ongoing. Anyone may become a member of CCS21 by registering online at no cost.

Members and media receive monthly updates in the form of commissioned columns on pertinent defence and security issues. Opportunities to participate in public forums such as the “Dialogue on Foreign Policy” launched by Foreign Affairs Minister Graham in January 2002 were highlighted. Members were responsive to letter-writing initiatives conducted in July and December, 2002. In the latter instance, there was a 20% response rate.

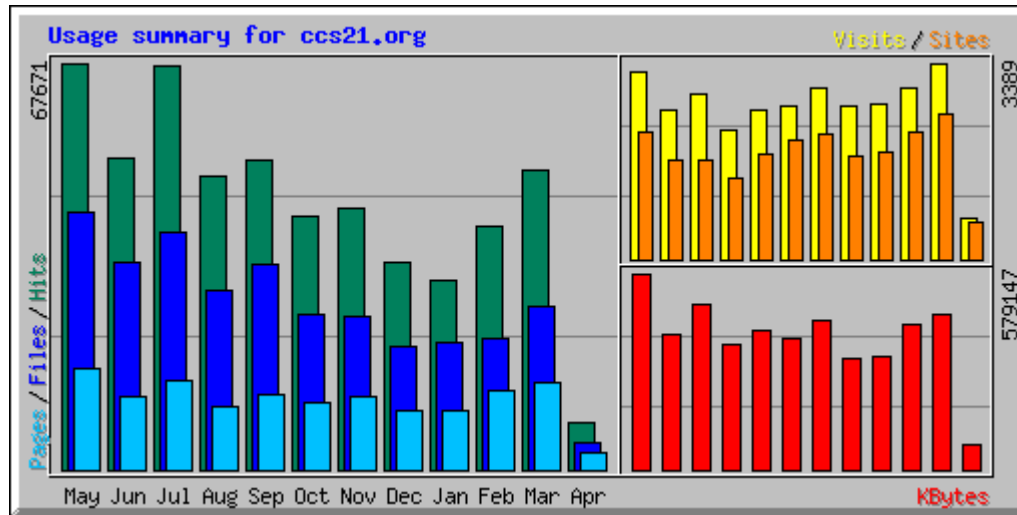
In September 2002, CCS21 presented a second report, “The People’s Defence Review” at a press conference in Ottawa, held in conjunction with the Conference of Defence Associations and other organizations. Media interest was generated by the release of the Review, and public awareness heightened. The total number of web site hits for this month alone was over 105,000.

In January 2003, an Advisory Committee was established to offer advice on defence policy and strategy. The members are:

In addition to both reports being available on the web, the web site offers monthly articles, research papers, a humour section, media coverage and links related to Canadian defence. In the past year, it has registered a total of 642,086 hits. A discussion board, added to the site in August 2002, has continued to attract members’ interest. Since January 2003, the number of participants has increased by almost 50% to 285. It is an outstanding success, encouraging people throughout the nation to not only comment on the monthly articles available on the web site, but also to discuss the state of Canadian defence in all of its aspects. As of January 2004, there were almost 5000 posts on hundreds of topics. The discussion board captures the essence of the mission of CCS21 which is to provide a meaningful forum for Canadians living in Canada and abroad to debate openly about defence policy and the future of the military. The discussion board is open to the public after registering online at <http://ccs21.org/cgi-bin/yabb/YaBB.cgi>.

CCS21 Web Site Statistics – February 2003 to January 30, 2004



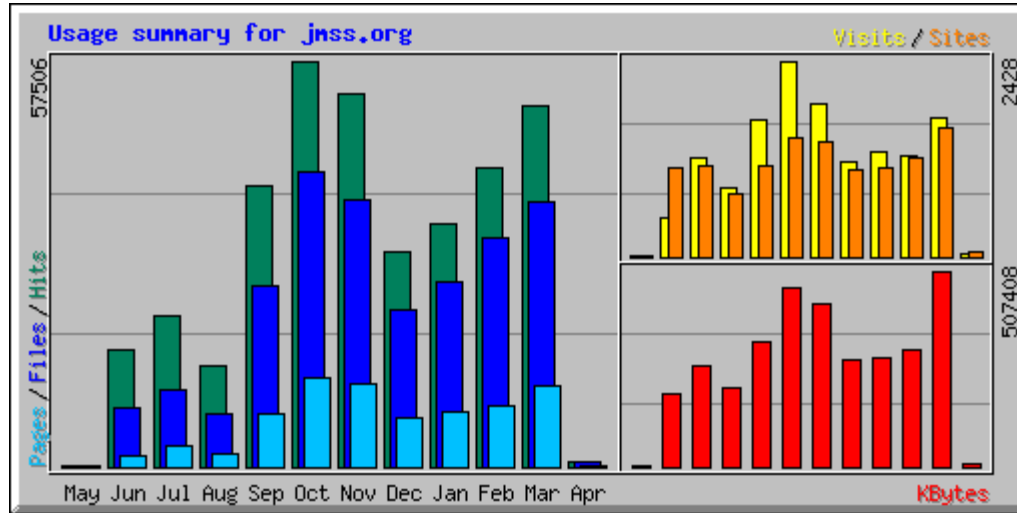
