Background

The Centre for Military and Strategic Studies (CMSS) at the University of Calgary is part of a nation-wide network of research centres funded by the Security and Defence Forum (SDF), a Department of National Defence (DND) sponsored grant program “geared towards stimulating and maintaining intellectual activity, research and dialogue with the Canadian academic community”. In October 2001, a Results-Based Management and Accountability Framework was established for the SDF; the ultimate outcome of the SDF is “to increase domestic knowledge of and interest in security and defence issues of current and future relevance to Canada”. Three intermediate outcomes for the SDF are:

- Satisfactory capacity of the Canadian academic community to contribute to public policy debates and public education on defence and security issues
- Healthy interest in security and defence-related issues among Canadian students
- Adequate awareness of security and defence issues among general public

The Centre’s goal is to provide the University, the general community, and the Department of National Defence with excellence in research, teaching, and an outreach program promoting military, security, and defence issues from a Canadian and international perspective. We will continue our fundraising efforts and look forward with enthusiasm to further contributing to the promotion of military, security and defence studies in Canada and abroad.

SECTION 1 – Mission Statement

1.1 What is the Centre's mission statement?

“To promote and develop excellence in military, security and defence studies from a Canadian and international perspective.”

Research Objectives

- Study of the citizen-soldier in Canada and within an international context
- Study of the military and the media in Canada
- Study of the importance of sea power to Canada as a trading and maritime nation, past, present and future
- Study of defence education
- Study of circumpolar security issues

Educational Objectives

- To support the Master of Strategic Studies (MSS) program aimed at Canadian and non-Canadian officer development and education
- To promote public awareness by developing curriculum packages, acting as a media resource centre and participating in and hosting public discussions on security, military and defence issues
- To issue policy and position papers on current Canadian military and defence policy matters
- To publish a semi-annual refereed academic electronic journal dedicated to security, military and defence studies

1.2 What is the relationship between the mission statement and the activities of the SDF Centre?

The Centre for Military and Strategic Studies strives *“to promote and develop excellence in military, security and defence studies from a Canadian and international perspective”* in all of its activities. CMSS has clearly identified its research and educational objectives, and continues to build strategically on existing strengths and comparative advantages.

The University of Calgary has identified Military and Strategic Studies as an area of “outstanding research performance”, noting that the research area draws from a strong interdisciplinary core as well as “significant multi-disciplinary linkages to produce a leading-edge research program that produces a prodigious amount of high quality, peer-reviewed scholarship.”

1.3 Describe briefly the regional and linguistic importance of the Centre and, where applicable, the importance of the Centre activities to various cultural communities.

As a leading Centre of Expertise in security and defence studies in Canada, and the only SDF centre in Alberta, CMSS continues to contribute to the fostering of informed public discussion and commentary on issues relating to military, security and defence studies through our activities and initiatives. Our use of information technologies, and in particular our monthly electronic Newsletter, *News & Views*, provides other SDF centres, DND personnel, associates, and the general public with information about upcoming events, recent activities, and highlights the work of the Centre as a whole, promoting the Centre and the importance of Canadian defence and security studies.

The Centre continues its collaboration with other SDF Centres, the Museum of the Regiments, Royal Military College, Canadian Forces College, DND and the CF, in particular, CFB Esquimalt, CFB Edmonton, CFB Yellowknife, and the general community.

We believe CMSS is well positioned to continue to contribute significantly to the field of Canadian defence and security studies, providing excellence in teaching, research, and outreach.

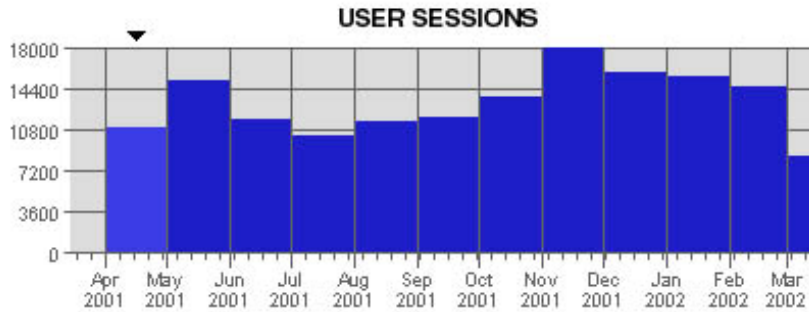

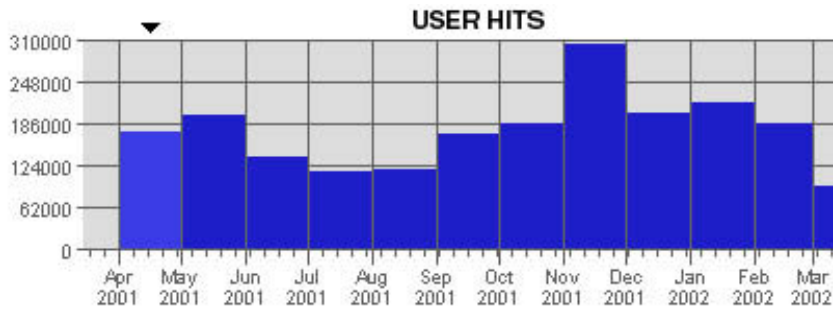

Outreach Curriculum Development. As part of the Centre's Outreach Program, the CMSS initiated a collaborative project with the Calgary Catholic School District (CCSD) and the Calgary Board of Education (CBE) to develop curriculum materials for secondary school students. This project is designed to provide high quality resources to schools related to the study of United Nations peacekeeping efforts, NATO, NORAD, and Canada's armed forces. CMSS researchers wrote the initial drafts of the curriculum materials, followed by extensive piloting and development by CCSD high school social studies teachers.
