Summary of Program Highlights

The Centre for Military and Strategic Studies (CMSS) at the University of Calgary remains committed to promoting and developing excellence in military, security and defence studies.

Overall University Context and Support

As mentioned in previous CMSS Annual Reports, the Board of Governors approved *Raising Our Sights*, an Academic Plan for the University of Calgary from 2002 to 2006. One of the five action items defined in the Plan is to “ensure that our core principles inform the future development and review of programs at the University of Calgary, and that they guide our thinking about the organizational structures that support and enable those programs.”

Immediate priorities are listed as:

- Systematize and harmonize our view of research strengths, graduate programs and academic units, including departments, faculties, research centres and institutes.
- Ensure both that the departments and faculties benchmark their activities and that the University assesses its quality against national and international standards of achievement and excellence.

In order for the University of Calgary to move forward and emerge as a leader in the areas defined as Academic Plan priorities, it is essential that panels of recognized experts assess its programs. Regular measurement and self-assessment will help ensure that the Core Principles of the Academic Plan are adhered to and guide resource allocation.

CMSS was selected as one of the first five units to be reviewed under the process. Dr. Dennis Showalter of Colorado College and Dr. Joel J. Sokolsky of the Royal Military College of Canada, served as external evaluators for CMSS. In advance of their onsite visit, January 10-11, 2005, the reviewers were supplied with extensive material on the Centre, including data on faculty, courses, finances, graduate students, and resources. In preparation for the assessment, the Centre held a Planning Day in August 2004 to review the Centre’s activities and make recommendations for future direction and included faculty, students, staff, alumni, and donors. The Centre is delighted with the external evaluation, and is examining the recommendations in detail.

The following highlights from the assessment deserve recognition.

“There is a strong sense of dedication and purpose amongst the academic and administrative staff and extremely positive morale within the graduate student body. This extremely positive attitude has been sustained despite the fiscal constraints that the CMSS, as part of the University, has had to cope with. Indeed the Centre has been able to fulfill its multiple objectives without unduly taxing University resources and has in fact been able to continue to attract a significant level of outside funding, particularly from the Department of National Defence’s (DND) Security and Defence Forum (SDF) program.”

“We cannot emphasize enough how impressed we were with the enthusiasm and commitment of the administrative support staff.”

“We believe that the CMSS merits additional support from the University, both in monetary terms and by encouraging it to expand its teaching and research activities.”

The Centre will provide an interim report to the University of Calgary, the SDF Program, and its donors on the status of the recommendations in the fall of 2005.

Engagement of Faculty and Students in SDF Program Activities

The number of U of C students and faculty directly engaged in SDF activities continues to expand. Course offerings and enrolments at both the undergraduate and graduate levels remain high.

The Centre graduated 3 MSS students in 2004-2005. As of January 2005, the Centre has 5 special case PhD students, and 36 Masters students with diverse backgrounds in history, political science, military engineering, mechanical engineering, and law. Offers of admission to 8 applicants have been made to date for the fall term 2005.

The Centre continued its support for graduate and undergraduate research assistants and its support of student activities. During the 2004-05 program year, 11 core faculty, 5 research associates, and 41 graduate students were engaged in SDF program activities. Graduate student applications for both the Master of Strategic Studies (MSS) and PhD programs increased significantly. The Centre was pleased to continue its support of the Society for Military and Strategic Studies (SMSS) and its 7th Annual Conference and the Calgary Model United Nations Team (UCMUNT).

SDF Program Highlights, 2004-05

The positive endorsement by Drs. Sokolsky and Showalter will assist the Centre in maintaining and building upon its strengths and existing expertise. The evaluators noted ***“the Centre’s combination of research and teaching is not duplicated by any other SDF-funded centre in Canada”***.

“A particular strength of the CMSS, and one that distinguishes it from other SDF centres and university institutes of international relations is its focus on “hard security issues”.

CMSS has carved out an important niche by placing a great deal of emphasis on matters that deal with military and defence issues, those that are especially germane to the organization and employment of armed forces in global relations.”

Funding

The Centre and its affiliates received over 60 new and continuing grants in 2004-2005, totalling over \$1,000,000 in support of graduate students, conferences, and research and program activities.

In February 2005, the Vice President (External Relations) announced a funding boost to the Centre. Two \$1 million donations to be paid out over five years were made in support of research, teaching, and outreach activities.

As a result, the Arthur Child Chair in Defence Economics will provide research and teaching on Canadian defence issues from an econometric perspective, the second pure defence economics position in Canada. The Chair and the Department of Economics will supervise and teach graduate students in the Master of Strategic Studies (MSS) program. The appointment is expected to be made in the fall of 2005.

The Canadian Defence & Foreign Affairs Institute Chair in Civil Military Relations will provide research and teaching expertise in civil-military relations. The appointment is expected to be made in the spring of 2005.

New Post-Doctoral Fellow top-up awards and Post Masters Internships will be awarded on a competitive basis, contributing to scholarly research and teaching on security and defence issues. Two Post-Masters Internships and one Post-Doctoral Fellow award were made in February 2004.

Graduate student support for the MSS program will be expanded as a result of the donations, along with new course offerings which include defence economics, military anthropology, unconventional warfare, domestic and hemispheric security, Arctic security, sea power, and ethics and morality in conflict. A Co-op program and a formal PhD program are also planned for the Centre.

With the U of C Press, the Centre intends to create a monograph series specializing in the Centre's research and teaching strengths.

Research and Teaching

As a result of new faculty and expertise associated with CMSS, the Centre revised its research foci to better reflect its research strengths. New calendar changes will indicate the following new areas of concentration:

- Canadian military studies
- Civil military relations
- Defence economics
- Unconventional warfare, including terrorism and counterinsurgency
- Domestic security/hemispheric security
- Ethics and morality in conflict
- Seapower
- Arctic security
- Strategic thought
- Israeli security studies

Curriculum Development

As the Centre has grown from four to forty MSS students in a short period of time, it has become apparent that students need to take as broad a program of core half courses as possible to prepare them for the job market or for another graduate degree. Areas of concentration are being added to reflect much more accurately the broadening of the Centre's options for scholarly specialization as well as to bring an organizational coherence to our expanded course offerings, particularly the many interdisciplinary areas of specialization. The following new courses will be offered:

New Courses:

STST 611 Canadian Military Studies

STST 619 War and Interpretation

STST 643 Topics on the History of the Israeli Defence Force

STST 657 Intelligence, Information Operations and Command, Control, Communications and Computers

STST 659 Seapower

STST 661 Circumpolar Security

STST 689 Unconventional Warfare

In addition, core courses will be required and electives will be offered from the areas of concentration: Arctic security, Canadian military studies, defence economics, domestic security/hemispheric security, ethics and morality in conflict, intelligence and security, Israeli security studies, civil military relations, seapower, and unconventional warfare. The Centre has proposed Calendar changes to recruit high quality students including increasing the minimum GPA admission requirement from 3.00 to 3.40.

The Centre is extremely proud of its graduate students and their accomplishments. Their input and enthusiasm has been invaluable to the Centre's success.

Outputs

Journal of Military and Strategic Studies

“The electronic Journal of Military and Strategic Studies is rapidly developing into a must-read, even in a discipline notoriously conservative in preferring paper as a means of communication.”

The *Journal of Military and Strategic Studies* continued to receive increasing attention, total hits to the JMSS Web Site increased from 266,816 in 2003/04 to 474,591. JMSS aims to be a journal of record for debates on contemporary Canadian strategic policy; to publish internationally on a regular basis; and to include graduate students, non-academic commentators, academic contributions, and serving and retired military officers.

Council for Canadian Security in the 21st Century

The Council for Canadian Security in the 21st Century (CCS21) was established in November 2001 to raise awareness of security and defence issues and to provide a meaningful forum for Canadians to debate openly about defence policy and the future of the military. Roger Sarty succeeded Jack Granatstein as Chair of CCS 21 effective February 2005.

Publications

The Centre’s faculty, research associates and graduate students sustained a strong publication record for 2004-05, publishing in over 60 academic and scholarly journals and academic and private presses.

Critical Infrastructure Project

Dr. Rob Huebert, Jillian Dowding, MA, and Maureen Shields, MSS candidate, have been providing their expertise as research consultants/advisors in a bi-national Canada-United States critical infrastructure project investigating threat assessment and vulnerabilities of the energy sector. CMSS is one of several partners in this endeavour that also include the Space and Naval Warfare Systems Command, Charleston, South Carolina (SPAWAR); Concurrent Technologies Corporation, Washington, DC; its Canadian affiliate *CTCanada*; and EWA-Canada. This project has produced its first report, detailing the current state of critical infrastructure protection in Canada, as well as recommendations regarding the establishment of a western region Critical Infrastructure Protection Centre (CIPC). This research has also incorporated new stakeholders, resulting in future collaborative opportunities for CMSS with both Emergency Management Alberta and the federal Department of Public Safety and Emergency Preparedness Canada (PSEPC).

Conferences and Events

The Centre sustained and expanded its organization and sponsorship with SDF support of over 30 lectures and seminars. Centre associates participated in more than 50 relevant conferences, workshops, seminars, and political meetings.

In November 2004, CMSS was pleased to host the SDF Centres and policy makers for the Security and Defence Studies in Canada Conference.

Collaboration

Closer collaboration resulted from the SDF conference in Calgary in November 2004 amongst faculty, administrators, and students.

On the U of C campus, the Centre continues its close cooperation with the Faculty of Social Sciences, the Faculty of Graduate Studies and the Departments of History, Political Science, Anthropology and Economics.

The reviewers recommended that “a cooperative arrangement with the RMC War Studies program would be beneficial and should be explored”. Dr. Bercuson is now engaging in consultations with RMC regarding such an arrangement.

Cooperative relationships with DND Public Affairs and the US Consulate-General in Calgary were continued at high levels of activity, benefiting both faculty and students. Opportunities to visit NORAD have provided students and faculty with invaluable learning experiences.

The Centre sustained and continued its collaboration with the Canadian Defence & Foreign Affairs Institute (CDFAI), co-sponsoring the *Journal of Military and Strategic Studies*, the Ross Ellis Memorial Lecture in Military and Strategic Studies, the November 2004 SDF Defence and Security Studies in Canada Conference, and the 7th annual SMSS conference.

The Centre is grateful for the guidance and support of its Advisory Council, Board of Directors, and the Library and Archives Advisory Board.

2005-06 Priorities

As a result of the Centre’s Planning Day in August 2004 and the two \$1 million donations, the Centre will embark on a communications and public relations plan to elevate the Centre’s profile as a leading Centre of Excellence in North America within the next five years. A Communications Consultant has been contracted to review the Centre’s website and marketing strategies and to promote the Centre through print materials and the Web Site.

Closer collaboration with CMSS Fellows and newly appointed adjunct fellows, cooperation with RMC and other DND organizations, continues to be a priority for CMSS. Establishing a competitive funding package for CMSS graduate students and support of scholarly activity is another very high priority.

Infrastructure continues to be a problem as CMSS continues to grow and does not currently have a capital budget allocation. Consultations with Dr. Pannekoek, Director of Information Resources, are ongoing regarding additional space to house research scholars at the Centre. Distance delivery of the MSS program will be re-examined; consultations with Athabasca University will be pursued.

Conferences

Chinese Military History Society Conference

May 2005 – Under the direction of Dr. David Wright, the University will host the Chinese Military History Society Conference, bringing together scholars of Chinese military history for an intensive workshop on the past, present and future of China's military heritage.

Continental Defence and Beyond: Canada's Place in the World

May 2006 – Under the direction of Dr. John Ferris, the aims of the conference are:

- to contribute to the formulation of Canadian and military policies, and to bring together scholars and defence planners from various countries;
- to build on the past work and reputation of CMSS and JMSS, and to create a synergy by combining the two;
- to expand standing of CMSS and JMSS among the world military academic community, and western staff officers and commands;
- to acquire material for subsequent special issues of JMSS.

The Special Commission on the Restructuring of the Reserves: 10 Years Later

December 2005 - Following on the two successful Reserves conferences held in Calgary, the Centre, in cooperation with the Canadian Defence & Foreign Affairs Institute, will examine the progress made in the ten years since the Special Commission on the Restructuring of the Reserves Report. The conference will be based on an update by Dr. Jack Granatstein and General Charles Belzile, two of the three original authors of the report.

Arctic Shipping

Under the direction of Dr. Huebert, the Arctic Shipping conference has now been scheduled for September 2005. This conference will bring together both Canadian and international experts to assess the impacts of climate change on Canadian arctic sovereignty and security. It will assess the nature of northern shipping and consider how Canada should prepare.

SDF Program Challenges

“As a valued unit within the University, the CMSS is a “winner” which has gone from strength to strength in recent years. Some of the problems it faces, such as the need to secure funding for graduate students and the requirements for additional space have arisen as a result of the continued success of the program.”

Infrastructure remains a concern for CMSS, as CMSS does not currently have a dedicated classroom for graduate seminars and speakers. With the addition of new graduate students, post-masters interns and post-doctoral fellows, CMSS requires additional space and infrastructure support to sustain the high level of activity at the Centre.

We have been asked this year to comment on the impact on activities if SDF funding were unavailable. The impact would be detrimental to the scholarly environment for graduate students and researchers. SDF funding directly supports graduate students to present their research at scholarly conferences, fostering a network of young scholars interested in security and defence issues. SDF funds a portion of the administrative staff at the Centre, and provides conference travel funds and thesis research awards to assist students in their academic careers.

In 2004, CMSS, in cooperation with the Canadian Defence and Foreign Affairs Institute (CDFAI), initiated a review of the high school curriculum Weblearn program. Following consultation with high school experts, it was determined that the project's current effectiveness and future potential could be better served with significant additional resources. The project has been taken over by the Dominion Institute based in Toronto.

Observations Concerning the 2004-05 Annual Report

The CMSS faculty, staff, research associates and students wish to acknowledge the ongoing support of the Department of National Defence, and particularly thank members of the office of the Directorate of Public Policy for their assistance. It was a pleasure hosting the SDF community for the conference and business meetings in November. We look forward to visiting another SDF Centre for future collaboration.

We extend special recognition and appreciation for the international conference travel fund initiated by SDF in 2003-04. We very much hope the program will be continued, allowing graduate students and researchers affiliated with CMSS to network and present their research internationally. We are thankful for the increased effort by SDF to schedule regular conference calls with Centre Directors, generate the informative SDF newsletters and create the experts database.

We appreciate and recognize the work of the SDF Selection Committee members in reviewing and providing feedback on the annual reports. The research, teaching, outreach, and educational opportunities at SDF Centres across Canada contribute significantly to the debate on defence and security issues facing Canada. SDF funding and recognition of this work is paramount to the continuation of the program.

With closer relationships with the SDF program in Ottawa and other SDF Centres of Expertise, CMSS looks forward to being a leader in military, security and defence studies in the years ahead.

The Centre has benefited from a strong faculty with international expertise on military, political and security issues in Political Science, History, and Law, and from collaboration with the Museum of the Regiments Library & Archives and support and guidance from its Advisory Council and Board.</p> <p>The U of C has experienced substantial growth over the past five years, absorbing more than 26% of the total growth in the post-secondary system in Alberta. The high level of interest shown by students in the fields of</p>

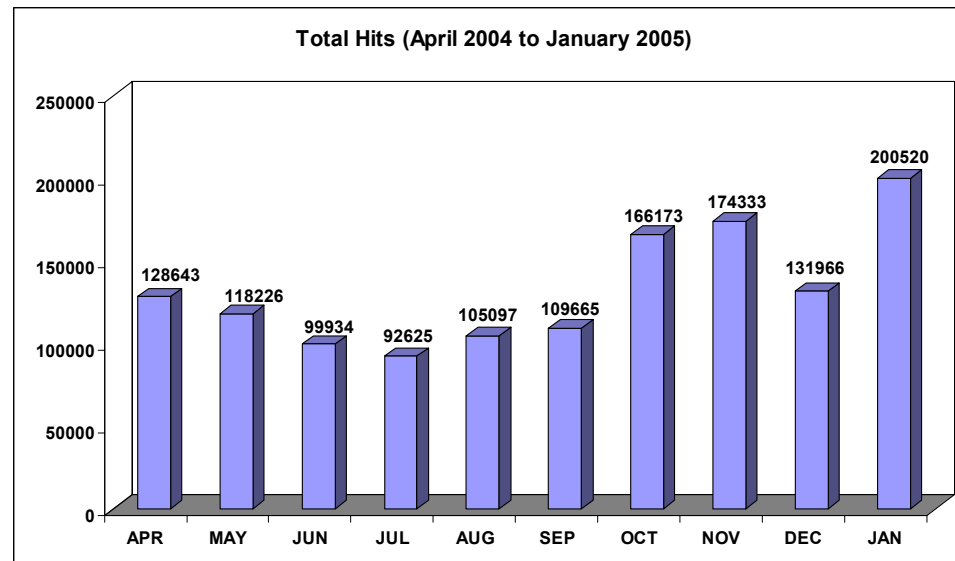
The number of hits and sessions on the CMSS website had decreased due to the following changes:

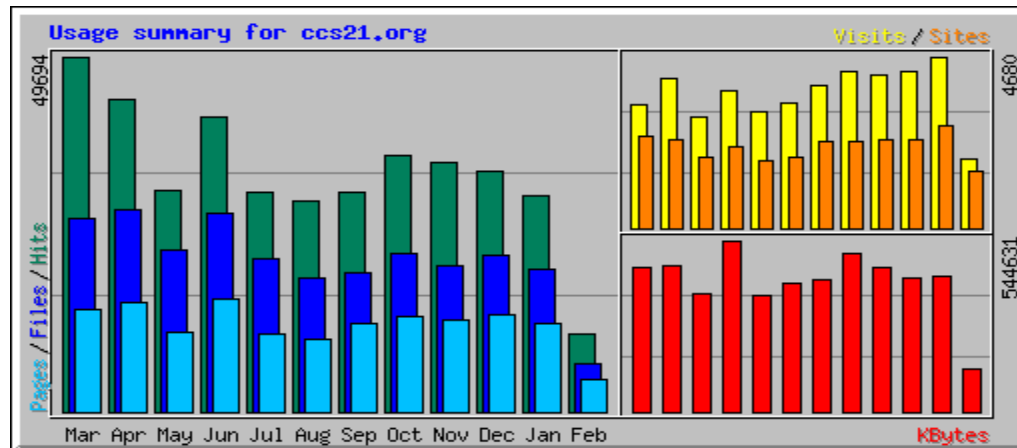


Council for Canadian Security in the 21st Century (CCS21.ORG) - March 1, 2004 to February 8, 2005

Initially organized by a group of concerned Canadians, CCS21 produced a report entitled, "To Secure a Nation" in November 2001 which urged the Government to undertake a full Defence and Security Review. The campaign to expand the membership of the advocacy group began in April 2002 through invitations by mail, a media awareness drive, public meetings, and the creation of a website, www.ccs21.org. CCS21 currently has 1380 members, an increase of approximately 10% over the previous year. Efforts to expand its membership are ongoing. Anyone may become a member of CCS21 by registering online at no cost.

In addition to CCS21 reports being available on the web, the web site offers monthly articles, research papers, a humour section, media coverage and links related to Canadian defence. In the past year, it has registered a total of 402,423 hits. A discussion board, added to the site in August 2002, has continued to attract members' interest.

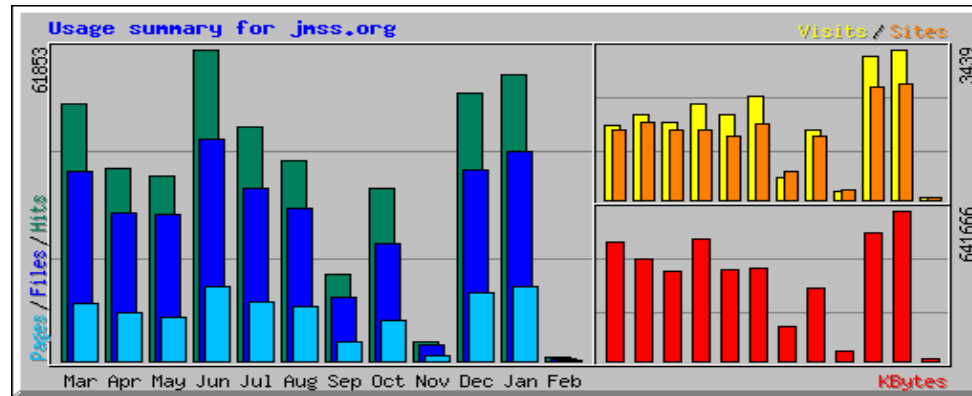
As of February 8, 2005, the number of participants has reached 415 with a total of 4410 posts involving 656 topics. It is an outstanding success, encouraging people throughout the nation to not only comment on the monthly articles available on the web site, but also to discuss the state of Canadian defence in all of its aspects. The discussion board captures the essence of the mission of CCS21 which is to provide a meaningful forum for Canadians living in Canada and abroad to debate openly about defence policy and the future of the military.
